It has been a challenging time for everyone involved as we now have completed most of the transition to McNeil Management Services. Alan Brown President PATRIOTIC FLAGS ARE AWESOME IN OUR COMMUNITY, BUT PLEASE REMEMBER THAT IF YOU HAVE A FADED OR TORN FLAG IT NEEDS TO BE TAKEN DOWN AND REPLACED. THE FADED OR TORN FLAG CAN BE TAKEN TO A LOCAL VFW POST AND WILL BE DISPOSED OF PROPERLY. REVIEW THE FLAG ETTIQUETTE BELOW FOR PROPER USE OF YOUR FLAG.

FLAG ETTIQUETTE FOR THE RED, WHITE AND BLUE By US Flag Code and Etiquette

Independence Day is a prime time for Americans to show their patriotic spirit by displaying the U.S. flag on their porches and in front of their homes. Before you start hanging up the red, white, and blue, it is a good idea to brush up on some flag etiquette and codes.

Here are few basic guidelines to keep in mind based on the U.S. Flag Code: These guidelines apply to the larger flags and not the small ones that are used in our flower beds.

- Always make sure the flag never touches the ground or anything below it.
- Do not display the American flag in inclement weather, unless it's an all-weather flag.
- If you want to fly the flag after sunset, keep it well lit.
- When you hang the flag vertically on a flat surface, make sure the Union (blue section) is on the observer's left.

The Flag Code, which formalizes and unifies the traditional ways in which we give respect to the flag, also contains specific instructions on how the flag is not to be used. They are:

- The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing. It is flown upside down only as a distress signal.
- The flag should not be used as a drapery, or for covering a speakers desk, draping a platform, or for any decoration in general. Bunting of blue, white and red stripes is available for these purposes. The blue stripe of the bunting should be on the top.
- The flag should never be used for any advertising purpose. It should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes, or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use. Advertising signs should not be attached to the staff or halyard
- The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, fireman, policeman and members of patriotic organizations.
- The flag should never have placed on it, or attached to it, any mark, insignia, letter, word, number, figure, or drawing of any kind.

The flag should never be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything. When the flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously. The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary.



ATTENTION HOMEOWNERS

***TRASH CANS:** Ensure your trash cans are put away and not visible from the outside of your home on the same day as trash pickup.

*SELLING YOUR HOME: You must use a branded for sale sign. Provided by 360 Signs

(see website for info). *TREES: The canopy over sidewalk should be lifted to at least 8 feet.

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THE FARM TO TABLE MARKET WAS APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON JUNE 11, 2019!

Even though 128 people signed the petition opposing the Farm to Table Market, the Board of County Commissioners approved the markets' request to proceed with building and operating a store at the front of the Estuary on the empty lot that has been for sale for some time. Our biggest concern is and was the entrance and exit onto Estuary Preserve Drive, but there were many other issues brought before the Board such as traffic on Balm Riverview Road, the blind corner on Estuary Preserve Drive, unwanted animals and bugs, security lighting that may affect homes, trash, noise due to trucks coming and going, and the many unwanted cars that may now be roaming through our neighborhood.

It will be imperative now that we all remain vigilant in order to keep our charming community safe. Remember to attend our Neighborhood Watch Meetings to keep you posted on all the safety issues concerning the Estuary.

Garden Tip Caring for Crape Myrtles

The beginning of June ushers in not only the rainy season, but bloom season for crape myrtles. They come in a variety of colors, are cold-hardy and are easy-care for our area. Below are a few tips for getting the most out of your crape myrtles.

1) **Prune in Winter** - Crape myrtles should be pruned in the winter-time, when they don't have any leaves. How much you prune is up to you, there is no need to do a severe prune (sometimes called 'crape murder'), but trimming back overall height if needed and thinning the branches will help the tree flush out well in spring. If you missed the pruning time in the winter, you can always prune later, just wait until after bloom time, otherwise you will cut off all of those beautiful flowers.

2) Water Wisely - Like any new plant, crapes want plenty of water to get started. However, once established they don't need a lot of extra water to keep them going. One good soaking each week is all they need through the spring, summer and fall and once thev are dormant in the winter, thev won't need much at all.

3) **Watch for Suckers** - No, we aren't on the lookout for a gullible person. All crape myrtles are naturally bushes. Even the pretty single trunk 'trees' are naturally bushes and will sometimes grow shoots from the ground, or lower down on the trunk. These shoots are called suckers. It doesn't mean anything is wrong, just trim them off when you see them to keep the energy of the plant headed up into the canopy.

4) Fertilize for the Best Blooms - Crapes aren't heavy feeders, but a spring, summer and fall dose of The Kerby's Special fertilizer will keep them in top shape and ready to produce the biggest, brightest clusters of blooms.

5) **Go for the Sequel** - If you dead-head crape myrtles and trim off old blooms just as they are finishing you can sometimes get a second, lighter set of blooms to emerge. Tough on really big crapes (since the flowers are so high up), but for your younger or smaller bushes or trees, you can extend your flower enjoyment.
